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Shen Wei - In Black, White and Gray Exhibition Opens During Art Basel Miami Week Featuring World Premiere Performances by Shen Wei Dance Arts

Presented by MDC Museum of Art + Design and MDC Live Arts

Miami, Oct. 22, 2014 – Miami Dade College's (MDC) Museum of Art + Design (MOAD) and MDC Live Arts present *Shen Wei – In Black, White and Gray*, the complete series of groundbreaking paintings unveiled for the first time in the U.S. with never-before-seen choreography by the award-winning artist. Five public performances by Shen Wei Dance Arts will coincide with the exhibition opening from Friday, December 5 to Sunday, December 7 during Art Basel Miami Beach week at MDC's National Historic Landmark Freedom Tower in downtown Miami. The exhibition of his paintings will remain on view at the museum through February 1, 2015. Both the exhibit and performances are free and open to the public.

An invitation-only preview and reception for select guests and Art Basel VIP Cardholders is scheduled for 8 p.m., Thursday, December 4. RSVP is required; working media are invited. A Collectors Cocktail and panel discussion with Shen Wei; Weng Ling, one of China's leading art curators and the founder and artistic director of the Beijing Center for the Arts; Dr. Karen Oen, Crow Collection of Asian Art curator; and Charles Reinhart, Director Emeritus of the American Dance Festival, will take place on at 4 p.m., Friday, December 5, at the Viceroy Miami hotel. As part of Art Basel Miami Beach's compelling Salon series—a program that offers unique insight into contemporary art practice—Shen Wei, MOAD Executive Director Jeremy M. Mikolajczak, and Weng Ling will appear together in conversation on Saturday, December 6 from 6 to 7 p.m. at the Miami Beach Convention Center.

Shen Wei - In Black, White and Gray is being presented at the College's flagship institution dedicated to the presentation and exhibition of visual art and design. This is Shen Wei Dance Arts' second visit to Miami presented by MDC Live Arts, having performed his acclaimed work *Rite of Spring* in 2003.

Unveiling 11 new paintings, this body of work is a study of contrasts: light and dark, turbulent and tranquil. They explore the nuances of a grisaille palette with shapes and forms powered by a dynamism and force suggestive of sublime landscapes, yet they recede into abstraction and the materiality of paint. In these canvases, Shen Wei's lifelong study of Chinese ink painting converges with his deep interest in Western oil painting, and is in dialogue with his choreography for this series.

Shen Wei has stated, "I was not taught the arts separately and I don't separate them in my work." Growing up in China, Shen Wei was immersed in the rigorous study of Chinese opera performance techniques, calligraphy, and Chinese and Western painting (the latter through "underground" access) before being drawn to modern dance as a teenager. From his earliest dances, Shen Wei has been interested in creating "a total work of art" – a Gesamtkunstwerk. Designing his own sets, costumes and make-up, he creates works where the visual environment and dance together shape a piece. Similarly, as a visual artist, he brings to his canvas the energy of movement. His artistry is galvanized by his enduring passion for the moving body and the moving brush.

Shen Wei, a choreographer, director, dancer, painter, and designer, is internationally renowned for the breadth and scope of his artistic vision. He is perhaps best recognized as the lead choreographer for the Opening Ceremonies of the 2008 Beijing Olympics, which earned acclaim worldwide. *The Washington Times* has called Shen Wei, "One of the great artists of our time," and *The New York Times* proclaimed, "If there is something to write home about in the dance world, it is the startlingly imaginative work of the Chinese-born choreographer Shen Wei."

His talent has earned him a MacArthur Foundation Fellowship, a Guggenheim Fellowship, Australia's Helpmann Award and the U.S. Artists Fellow Award. Last year, Shen Wei was honored as Artist of the Year by Audi-China and *GQ-China*, and Innovator of the Year by the *Wall Street Journal-China*. Recently, his work as a visual artist and choreographer has entered into a new dialogue in a series of performative installations and site-specific works, which have been presented at a number of museums and galleries, including The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the North Carolina Museum of Art in Raleigh, N.C, Collezione Maramotti in Reggio Emilia, Italy, the Rockbound Museum of Art in Shanghai, China, the Forum at the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts in San Francisco, CA, and the Kennedy Center Atrium in Washington, DC.
